Trinity Cathedral Hosts the Joint Lenten Service. Please join us TODAY at 5 p.m. to take part in the Joint Lenten Service which will be held at Trinity Cathedral. This is a great opportunity to meet and form new friendships with parish members from the surrounding City of Miami Black churches. Following the service, there will be a reception in Cathedral Hall. We will need volunteers to help the San Pasquale Hospitality Guild in spreading Trinity hospitality. How can you help? Do you like to bake? If so, please bring any type of cookies or brownies (nothing that requires plates or forks please) to Cathedral Hall on Sunday the 14 before 5 p.m. Don't like to bake? If you have volunteer time to spare, please come to Cathedral Hall to help with set-up, serving and clean-up during any of the following time slots: 4-5 p.m. or 6:30-7:30 p.m. and 7:30-8:30 p.m.

Second Sunday Outreach to benefit Haiti. Today, the second Sunday of the month, you will find special envelopes in your bulletin. Please consider making an offering to this important arm of the church which helps support Relief Efforts through the Episcopal Church in Haiti. All contributions from the Joint Lenten Services will support this ministry, and we are hoping to raise \$15,000 thousand dollars by next Sunday.

Forum on Haiti: A Cathedral Forum treating issues around the recent earthquake in Haiti will be held Sunday, March 21 at 11:45 a.m. in All Saints' Chapel, led by The Rev. Lauren R. Stanley, who is an Appointed Missionary of The Episcopal Church serving in the Diocese of Haiti, the largest diocese in the Church. Since the Jan. 12 earthquake, she has been serving as an assistant to Bishop Jean Zache Duracin, assigned to coordinate relief and recovery efforts among the international partners of the Diocese of Haiti, as well as with Episcopal Relief and Development. Before moving to Haiti in August 2009, she spent four years, from 2005 to 2009, serving as the Episcopal Church's only full-time missionary in Sudan, where she taught Theology, English, Liturgics and Biblical Greek at the Renk Theological College in Renk, South Sudan. She specialized in mission work both domestic and foreign before becoming a full-time missionary. She is the author of the *Short-Term Mission Handbook*. Before ordination, Stanley was a journalist for 20-plus years, as well as a Peace Corps volunteer serving in Kenya in the mid-1980s. This will be a powerful and personal look at the church and wider situation in Haiti today; please join us!

Stress Relief Offered at Trinity: On Thursday evening, March 25, professional instructors in stress reduction and breath techniques will be offering a workshop for all those who have suffered trauma, stress, or anxiety around the recent Haiti earthquake. This workshop will be offered in English, Spanish, and Creole (simultaneously) in Cathedral Hall. Workshop is free to the public and begins at 7:00 p.m.

Other ways to help Haiti: From March 1-22, there will be a trailer set up at St. Paul et les Martyrs d'Haiti, (6744 N. Miami Ave., Miami), for collection of supplies for Haiti. Fr. Smith Milien, priest-in-charge of St. Paul's, is requesting medical and hygiene supplies, towels, toys and non-perishable (preferably ready-to-eat) food—but NO clothing. Also, on March 20 at 5 p.m., there will be a Eucharist (celebrated in French and Creole) at St. Paul's to pray for the people of Haiti and to bless the trailer before it is shipped. Everyone in the diocese is invited.

Lunchtime recitals continue each Friday in Lent. This year's Lenten lunchtime recital series, entitled "Bach Plus", features five half-hour organ recitals. This Friday, Simon Jacobs will perform two monumental organ works: Johann S. Bach's Prelude and Fugue in E flat major and Healey Willan's Introduction, Passacaglia and Fugue in E flat minor. Simon is organist at St. Thomas Episcopal Parish, co-director of the Anglican Chorale here at Trinity and has recently been accepted to study for a Master's degree in Choral Conducting at Yale which he will begin this Fall. Next Friday: The Meridian Ensemble (Classical Trio) performs works by Bach and Mozart.

Choral concert at Trinity Cathedral next Friday: The Riverside High School Women's Choir from Greer, SC will be visiting and performing an informal concert at Trinity Cathedral next Friday March 26 at 3 p.m.

St. Mark Passion by Charles Wood: At the 6 p.m. service on Palm Sunday (March 28) the Anglican Chorale will sing an Anglican setting of the Passion according to Saint Mark. The work features prominent solo parts for the Evangelist and Jesus, as well as chorus and organ, interspersed with hymns for the congregation. This Passion setting was composed in 1920 and commissioned by King's College Cambridge. The liturgy will last around an hour and a reception will follow.

"The Way of the Cross" and Bible Study will continue every Friday in Lent at 6:00 p.m. Come take part in a fresh way in this traditional Lenten devotion that helps us grow in compassion and identification with Christ. The Way of the Cross will be followed by a simple soup and bread supper and a Lenten Bible study. We will conclude by 7:30 p.m.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available: For those who would like to include the rite of reconciliation (confession) as part of their Lenten practice, this is an opportunity to take stock of your "growth areas." If you are interested, please see one of the clergy.
